	2) To increase teachers' confidence in delivering PE lessons following a mentoring programme with a PE specialist and to provide staff with opportunities to work alongside sports-specific coaches.
	3) To provide school staff with access to courses and information to continue to develop PE and Sport at Brigstock Latham's Primary School in line with National PE, Sport and Health initiatives.
	4) To access opportunities for the pupils to experience competitive situations. These give them opportunities to: work as a team, be proud to represent their school or House, appreciate the need to practice hard, abide by rules and support each other in victory or loss.
	5) To provide all the children with opportunities to be physically active at break times, with access to equipment.
	6) To provide a year-round calendar of extra-curricular clubs allowing pupils to develop sport-specific interests in a familiar setting.
